

BREAST THERMOGRAPHY

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Breast thermography, or digital infrared imaging, looks at the effect of tumor growth on tissues, rather than looking for the tumor itself. These early changes (such as new blood supply a tumor needs to grow) are visible in the breast 8 to 10 years before a tumor is large enough to show up on imaging such as mammogram or ultrasound, which are looking to actually see the tumor. Knowing about abnormal changes at this early stage can give you the opportunity to rebalance the body early and possibly prevent further tumor formation. Thermography was FDA approved in 1982 for adjunct breast screening. It is painless and harmless, as it does not use Xray.

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
